This collection includes many of the legal writings of Louis D. Brandeis before his appointment to the U.S. Supreme Court in 1916 and sheds light on U.S. social and legal history during the late 19th and 20th centuries. The papers are divided into six sections: The Early Years; The Concerned Citizen; Labor & Social Welfare; Women's Working Hours and Wage Scales; The Railroads and Trusts Monopolies & Big Business.

Business and City Directories from Russia and the USSR

1892 - 1940

These directories offer a broad picture of Russian society in an age of dynamic social and economic change. As Russia's modernization accelerated toward the end of the 19th and beginning of the 20th centuries, social identities were in flux as peasants moved to urban areas to join the burgeoning industrial labor force; scions of the traditional nobility were selling their increasingly impoverished estates to become members of the nascent professional middle class; and government bureaucrats began filling positions in newly created government organs. The city and business directories capture these phenomena in a unique way by detailing these social and demographic changes of new Russia in a public, commercial medium.

- **Ves Sankt-Peterburg (All St. Petersburg), 1892-1940**
 For St. Petersburg, no volumes were published for 1918-1922 or for 1936-1938. The library's holdings are complete and also include the series Address Book of the City of St. Petersburg, 1892-1902. It was clearly the original on which the All Petersburgs were based. While not every person in St. Petersburg was listed, most were, including their professions. Furthermore, each volume includes an alphabetical index so one does not need to know the address in advance. Each volume lists houses according to districts and streets with names of owners and their professions. Local maps help bring the city to life for the researcher. The volumes also list all government offices and their employees. Searches for particular family lines or persons can be carried out using the last-name index, which also includes first name and patronymic.

- **Vsia Moskva (All Moscow), 1875-1917**
 The collection covers 42 years and in most cases there is one volume per year (for 1895, 1896 and 1903 there are two volumes per year.) Nine of the volumes in the collection contain maps, with a total of 70 maps for 1903 and 1904 alone. These directories list names and addresses of all Moscow's inhabitants with their occupation and place of work; Lists of streets, with buildings and house-owners arranged by streets and police precincts; City plans, including special maps of theaters, circuses, etc; Lists of personnel in state, public and private institutions in Moscow; Churches and monasteries (with brief information on priests); Hospitals and personnel lists for each hospital; Practicing physicians arranged by specialization and location (street address); Lawyers, their assistants, architects and artists; and Factories, plants and companies in Moscow and its suburbs.

- **VSIA Rossiia (All Russia) & Ves SSSR (All USSR), 1895-1931**
 Each volume contains lists of people who owned businesses - from large factories to small grocery stores - in cities and towns throughout the entire Russian Empire and later the Soviet Union. Some of the volumes are organized by guberniia, with general information about each guberniia in an introductory section, others by profession. Each volume includes a list of government officials and public institutions. As a large number of the names listed are Jewish, the directories should be of particular interest to Jewish families researching family origins.

Card Catalog of Jewish Newspapers and Periodicals in the Russian National Library

1880 - 2000

The holdings of Jewish newspapers and periodicals cover the period from the early 1880s to 2000. They include not only periodicals published in the Russian Empire and the former Soviet Union, but also in countries such as Poland, Romania and later Israel. The card file is divided into two parts - Hebrew and Yiddish. The newspaper section contains runs of *Der Veg*, *Folkstime*, *Der Roiter Stern*.

One of the world's most important manuscript and codex collections of Jewish prayers from Germany, Spain, North Africa, Yemen, India and Persia. The collection also includes Hebrew religious poetry and illuminated manuscripts.

- **Maimonides' Mishneh Torah**

The first comprehensive code of Jewish Law, encompassing all the intricacies of Talmudic learning and erudition. Many are dated by the Seleucid era and are written in a square rabbinic hand.

The Collective Catalogue of Hebrew Manuscripts

1950 - 1988

The Collective Catalogue of Hebrew Manuscripts on microfiche reproduces two major catalogues at the Jewish National and University Library in Jerusalem: the catalogue of the Institute of Microfilmed Hebrew Manuscripts and that of the Library's own Department of Manuscripts. The first contains details of approximately 50,000 codices and 200,000 fragments found in some 700 collections traced in libraries, museums, cathedrals, colleges, synagogues and private collections in 30 countries. The Institute has been systematically collecting Hebrew manuscripts since 1950 and new items, now recorded in an on-line catalogue, are being added all the time. The Jewish National and University Library's own collection of Hebrew manuscripts includes some 7,750 manuscript codices from the 10th century onwards, some of them finely illuminated. A union catalogue of virtually all the Hebrew manuscript holdings in the world, the Collective Catalogue is an essential reference work for all researchers in Jewish and Hebrew studies and biblical history.

Franco-Jewish Pamphlets

1850 - 1920

The Alliance Israelite Universelle, located in Paris, France, was founded in 1860. Today it is one of the most significant international organizations for research and teaching of Jewish culture. The Alliance's objective is to create greater awareness of Jewish culture, remaining true to tradition and tolerant and open to the modern world. The Alliance boasts one of the most important collections of Judaica, housed in the library, which includes a great number of treasures, such as an extraordinary collection of Hebrew manuscripts and a donation from the Rabbi Zadoc Kahn of hundreds of Hebrew and Latin brochures. From the riches of this library comes the Franco-Jewish pamphlet collection - never before available on microfilm.

This collection of 1,290 Franco-Jewish pamphlets contains a great number of sermons given by notable rabbis, many unpublished anywhere else; treatises on Jewish customs and traditions; information on anti-Semitism; Zadoc Kahn's speeches from the 1890's and much more. Covering from the mid-1800's up to the 1920's, these pamphlets portray the cultural, spiritual and religious life of Jews in Paris as well as in the French colonies of North Africa. For the most part in French, there are a small number of pamphlets in English, Italian and Latin. ProQuest is pleased to make this content available in microfilm for the first time to scholars and researchers world-wide.

German Nationalism, National Socialism and Postwar Reconstruction (NSDAP)

1918 - 1949

This important microfiche collection contains more than 1,400 titles published from 1918 to 1949 by various National Socialist German Workers' Party (NSDAP) organizations and their precursors, as well as by publishers sympathetic to the Nazi party and regime. The materials depict the political and social crises that led to the rise of National Socialism in Germany as they were expressed in everyday contemporary society. The materials range from administrative reports of the Third Reich to mass-market propaganda in the form of pamphlets, popular magazines and booklets. Among the dozens of topics covered by this wide array of material are the establishment of Nazi organs, the implementation of pre-Weimar Nazi policy and the postwar dismantling of the party organizations. This resource also contains publications and documents that were produced by anti-Nazi organizations or commentators who opposed Nazism both during and after the collapse of the Third Reich.

After World War II, possession of such material in Germany and former occupied territories by ordinary citizens came to be incriminating evidence of Nazi sympathies and much material of this nature was destroyed as a result. Consequently, the material in the present collection is rarely held by research libraries and is difficult to obtain for scholarly purposes. Approximately twenty percent of the publications preserved in the collection are the only copies known to exist; the remainder exist in extremely limited numbers and are found in only a handful of institutions in Europe and North America. Though much of the content—and even the existence of these materials—may be deemed offensive, the collection forms an important historical record and constitutes a surprisingly complete body of documentary evidence of the propaganda, financial, political and social apparatus behind the Nazi regime. The publications, which are in excellent and legible condition, have been stored under special restricted access and have been circulated sparingly to readers as part of an uncataloged backlog for over 50 years. The fiche collection is organized topically with an introduction to each section provided in the Printed Guide by James H. Spohrer, Librarian for the Germanic Collections, Doe Memorial Library, University of California, Berkeley.

Goldman, Emma. The Emma Goldman Papers

'Anarchy stands for the liberation of the human mind from the dominion of religion; the liberation of the human body from the dominion of property; liberation from the shackles and restraints of government.'

~ Emma Goldman

Emma Goldman (1869-1940) was perhaps the most famous anarchist of her day speaking out on major social issues including birth control, union organization and equality and independence for women. Dubbed 'Red Emma' by the press, she worked tirelessly, lecturing and writing, for causes linked to individual freedom. Often harassed and arrested, particularly for her opposition to World War I, she played a pivotal role in the drive to secure freedom of speech in America. For ten years the staff of the Emma Goldman Papers Project has been collecting material from public and private repositories all over the world. Now published on microfilm, The Emma Goldman Papers contain over 22,000 documents - letters, essays, speeches, government files, newspaper clippings - charting the life of one of the most influential and controversial women in modern American history. The letters record Goldman's life as an activist and public figure with correspondents including such important figures as V.I. Lenin, John Dewey, Bertrand Russell, George Bernard Shaw, H.G. Wells, Margaret Sanger, Havelock Ellis and Harold Laski. The government documents include surveillance files on Goldman together with court records and transcripts of her various trials. A wide-ranging resource of interest to researchers in social, legal and cultural history, peace studies, women's studies as well as modern drama, educational reform, psychology, the Russian Revolution and the Spanish civil war.

Gubernskie Vedomosti

1838 - 1920

The Gubernskie Vedomosti were pre-revolutionary local governmental chronicles published throughout the Russian Empire largely between 1838 and 1917 (although a few titles were issued through 1920.) The Gubernskie Vedomosti featured a variety of information on current local events, plants and factories, sales and market prices, agriculture, transportation, the activity of specific societies, hospitals, educational institutions, libraries, etc. Educational articles on history, geography and economics were also included. In addition, everything from weather forecasts to advertisements could be found here including, on occasion, reprinted material such as diaries, archival documents, biographies and folklore. The Hebraica and Judaica of the Tychsen Collection and the Rostock University Library*

1734 - 1815

In 1817, Rostock University acquired the private library, including the manuscript legacy, of Oluf Gerhard Tychsen (1734-1815). In 1760, Tychsen began working at the then newly-established Bützow University in Mecklenburg and in 1763 he was offered a chair of oriental languages. In addition to that, he also worked as a librarian. After the reunion of the universities of Rostock and Bützow in 1789, he moved to Rostock. At the time of his death, Tychsen's private library consisted of about 10,000 volumes. His excellent bibliographical skills and his passion for collections resulted in a treasury of books that was anything but average. Apart from the sale of a few surplus copies during the 19th century, the collection remains nearly complete and forms the heart of the university's Hebraica and Judaica inventory. It is being supplemented by books from other ducal Mecklenburg libraries as well as several acquisitions made by the university itself. These items make the Rostock Hebraica and Judaica one of the most remarkable collections on the European Continent. This collection is divided into the following four sections:

- **The Old Yiddish Literature**

The nearly 400 titles of this edition offer a cross-section of the history of Yiddish books up to the 19th century. There are numerous rarities and unica, including the first Yiddish printing, *Mirkevet ha-Mishne*, Krakau 1543. Among translations and paraphrases of the Bible the collection contains the Konstanz-edition (1544) as well as translations by Blitz and Witzenhausen. Three of the existing editions of the *Tsene-rene* (Frankfurt a.M. 1685, Sulzbach 1702) were first discovered in Rostock and the third of those (Fürth [Pseudo-Amsterdam] 1761) is apparently to be found nowhere else. One of the rarities among the prayer-books is a Hebrew Siddur. It contains Yiddish passages and was published in 1560 in Mantua. The collection chronologically focuses on the 18th century. Therefore, it can be seen as an extension of the 17th century book collection by Johann Chr. Wagenseil (1633-1707), who lived exactly 100 years earlier than Tychsen.

- **Yiddish Philology**

At the center of Yiddish philology are books reflecting the analysis of Judaism made by Christian scholars. Already in the 16th century, the *Taitsch for Jews*, which contained Hebrew letters, attracted their attention. Scholars such as Elias Schade and Thomas Blebel, Jr., who both lived at the turn of the 16th century, often combined Hebrew grammar with introductions to *Jüdisch-Deutsch* in their works.

- **Missionary Writings**

In many aspects, Tychsen's legacy shows a missionary tendency that was characterized by Pietism. Printings of treatises or of the Bible, published by Callenberg's *Institutum Judaicum* (1728-92), are an important part of the collection. It consists of more than 30 titles and thus comprises over two thirds of the Yiddish missionary treatises, several of them existing in various editions and, according to the addressee, with either the title and preface in Latin or completely in *Jüdisch-Deutsch*, or German written in the Hebrew alphabet.

- **Pocket Diaries**

A collection of more than 80 copies of 69 different Jewish pocket diaries is also noteworthy. They were all produced between 1712 and 1814 in such diverse locations as Altona, Amsterdam, Berlin, Frankfurt (Oder), Fürth, Hamburg, Jessnitz and Sulzbach. Pocket diaries were considered articles of daily use and were thus generally not collected by libraries. However, they offer interesting information on folklore and folk medicine and there is a visible analogy to Christian calendars. A dozen broadsheets form an additionally remarkable part of the collection. Three of them date from the 17th and the 18th century, the others were printed during the revolution of 1848 and make use of the Yiddish language as a means of political satire.

Justice Charles Gray found Lipstadt innocent and dismissed the charge.

The Jewish Collection: The Writings of Rabbi Isaac Mayer Wise

Rabbi Isaac Mayer Wise came to the United States in 1846 and for more than half a century, he was an active participant in the religious life of American Jewry. The collected writings of Rabbi Wise, founder of modern American Reform Judaism, are available for students of religion, theology and religious history. Wise was the prime figure in establishing the famous Anglo-Jewish newspaper, *The American Israelite*. He also founded the Union of American Rabbis and the Hebrew Union College. The entirety of American Jewish life has been significantly influenced by this man's contributions. The collection includes the religious writings of Rabbi Wise, his correspondence, published reports, addresses, sermons, book excerpts and newspaper and journal pieces. Also included are the newspapers edited by Rabbi Wise, *The American Israelite* and *Deborah*. The collection is accompanied by a hardbound guide containing a biography of Rabbi Wise, written by Sefton Timken, a leading Wise scholar. There is also a theological biography, consisting of writings by Dr. Jacob Rader Marcus, Director of the American Jewish Archives at the Hebrew Union College in Ohio, plus a complete cross-referenced table of contents.

Nicolaevsky, Boris I. The Boris I Nicolaevsky Collection

1887 - 1986

The Boris I. Nicolaevsky Collection contains hundreds of thousands of rare and valuable documents relating to one of the greatest political upheavals of all time - the Russian Revolution. For ease of access, the collection is organized into 280 subgroups. Most subgroups are established on the basis of provenance. Many contain notes by Nicolaevsky about the person or organization in question. Within the 81 topical subgroups, containing collected memoirs, letters, reports and printed matter are:

Pinkasim were record books of various Jewish organizations in a particular town or village. The organizations generally covered by pinkasim included prayer groups, study groups, burial societies, societies that helped the sick, synagogues and occasionally guilds associated with synagogues. The pinkasim, usually in the form of ledger books, contained such information as membership history and the by-laws or statutes of societies. The three pinkasim in this collection are among only a few of their kind surviving from Eastern Europe, making them extremely important research tools for genealogists. They contain beautiful illustrations, as well as finely-rendered calligraphy.

From its beginnings in 1881 it has grown to be a major repository of important cultural artifacts of the former Jewish communities of Poland and the adjacent regions. It employs a polyglot staff and houses a museum, library and archive that hold rare print and photographic artifacts that recall a lost world of Jewish life and culture. The Institute is adjacent to the former site of Warsaw's largest synagogue, which was destroyed by the Nazis in May 1943 as a gesture of "victory" over the Warsaw Ghetto uprising.

The Wagenseil Collection*

1633 - 1705

Johann Christoph Wagenseil was born in Nuremberg in 1633 and died in Altdorf in 1705. After completing his studies, he traveled the countries of Europe and the Near East for more than ten years as a private tutor and tutor to princes. During his travels Wagenseil was already able to lay the foundation for his library. For in 1666 when, under the influence of the pseudo-messiah Sabbethai Zvi, many Jews sold their possessions, he succeeded in acquiring a number of extremely rare Hebraic works in Amsterdam. From 1667 onwards Wagenseil was professor of history and public law, from 1674 of oriental studies and from 1697 of canon law at The University of Altdorf. Wagenseil himself was the writer and editor of several important works on Jewish culture. Amongst other things he had rare Jewish writings reprinted, as with the *Tela Ignea Satanae* (Satan's Burning Arrow), Altdorf 1681 (VK 112; 113). In addition to a Jewish-German abridged grammar, he published a small chrestomathy of Yiddish writings under the title *Belehrung der Jüdisch-Teutschen Red- und Schreibart* (Information on Jewish-German idiom and style), in Königsberg in 1699.

Shortly after Wagenseil's death in 1705, his heirs began their endeavors to sell the collection of books. However it was not until 1780 that the transaction was finally concluded and the University of Altdorf purchased the collection of approximately 600 titles, bound in 300 volumes. The collection is divided, as we know today, roughly as follows: 150 volumes of Hebraic writings, i.e. writings by Jews for Jews in the Hebrew language, 55 volumes of Hebrew writings by Christian Hebraists and 95 volumes of philological literature from Abyssinian and Arabic through Greek and Japanese to Persian and Syrian. The main emphasis of the contents is on bibles (monolingual, bilingual and multilingual parallel editions), editions of the Talmud, descriptions of life and customs, historical literature, grammars and dictionaries, as well as rarities of Jewish-German literature. Among the oldest copies in the Wagenseil Collection are *Elia Levita, Capitula Cantici...*, Basle 1527 and *Moses Maimonides, Logica Sapientis*, Basle 1527 (VK 248). The oldest Arabic copy of *Avicenna's, Canon*, Rome 1592, various works by the Leiden orientalist, Thomas Erpenius (1584-1624) as well as some Syrian copies from Paris (early 17th century) are also worth mentioning.

The debate over the Rosenbergs' innocence is as contested today as it was nearly 50 years ago. Those who believe they are innocent see the husband and wife as either heroic martyrs or tragic scapegoats. Others see them as victims of alleged anti-Semitic views held by many high-ranking U.S. Government officials during that time. Those convinced of their guilt see them as vicious traitors who put the lives of every U.S. citizen in jeopardy during one of the nation's most vulnerable times.
