



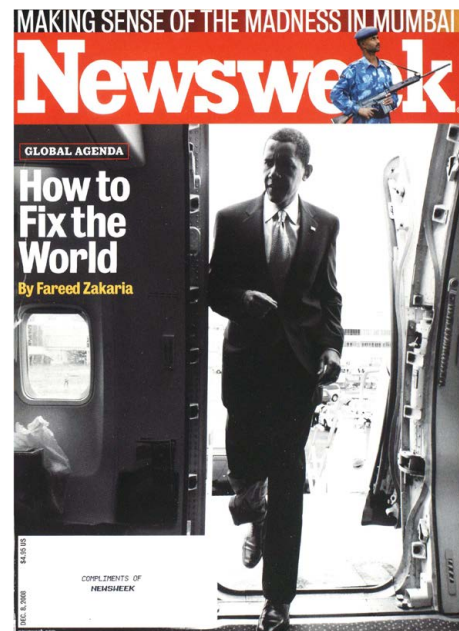

Launched on February 17, 1933, *Newsweek* has since become one of the most influential magazines of the 20th/21st centuries, with an international circulation that peaked at more than 3 million. With its high-quality reporting, analysis, commentary, and reviews, this magazine charts the key US and global events and issues across eight decades. It has been renowned for its investigative reporting and its extensive coverage of controversial topics in politics, discrimination, civil rights, climate change, immigration reform, healthcare, international affairs, and more. It took a leading role in investigating the Watergate scandal and, in April 1983, became one of the first magazines to run a cover story about AIDS.

*Newsweek* has also featured diverse content beyond news and politics (in areas including business, science/technology, arts/entertainment, travel, and family life). The archive offers valuable content for researchers across multiple fields.
